

Domestic Violence and Abuse Services in Newcastle

Domestic violence and abuse has a profound impact on individuals, families and communities. In Newcastle we have a broad range of services to support victims and survivors of domestic violence and abuse including raising awareness, reducing risk, providing support and moving victims and their families towards recovery.

Newcastle Integrated Domestic Abuse Service (NIDAS)

An integrated service that can be accessed by anyone aged 16 years and over, irrespective of their ethnicity, religion or sexual orientation, and provides:

- a single point of contact through a 24 hour telephone service which provides information, advice and guidance, carries out an assessment of need and also admits people into the service;
- crisis accommodation and resettlement support for women and their children with 1, 2 and 3 bedroomed self-contained apartments on a single safe and secure site. One of the units is fully compliant with the Disability Discrimination Act;
- specialised support for children, young people and families who are accessing the integrated service:
- preventative outreach support for men and women; and
- Independent Domestic Violence Advocacy (IDVA) and Independent Sexual Violence Advice (ISVA) for people at high risk of harm.

The service can also support men to access safe accommodation.

Providing 1 to 1 practical and emotional support for victims and survivors of domestic abuse from age 11 years plus. Safe4Life course for teenagers, and recovery course for adult victims and survivors. Teenage DV peer educators provide 1 to 1 practical and emotional support for teenage victims and survivors.
