Regulation 19 Decision Statement

Newcastle City Council has resolved to ‘make’ the Dinnington Parish Neighbourhood Plan. The Dinnington Parish Neighbourhood Plan has been brought into legal force. It now forms part of the statutory Development Plan for the Dinnington Parish Neighbourhood Area which comprises the whole of the civil parish of Dinnington. Decisions on planning applications must now be made in accordance with policies in the Dinnington Parish Neighbourhood Plan unless material considerations indicate otherwise.

The Dinnington Parish Neighbourhood Plan was submitted to Newcastle City Council in November 2024. Publicity was undertaken in accordance with the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012. A report following Independent Examination of the Plan was published in April 2025. This report found that the Dinnington Parish Neighbourhood Plan meets the basic conditions and that, subject to modifications, the Dinnington Parish Neighbourhood Plan should proceed to referendum. The City Council accepted the examiner’s recommendations. A local referendum was held on 22 May 2025. A majority of those voting were in favour of the Plan being used by the City Council in making decisions on planning applications.

The Dinnington Parish Neighbourhood Plan complies with legal requirements governing the making of neighbourhood development plans set out in the Planning Acts and associated Regulations. Accordingly, I hereby confirm that the Dinnington Parish Neighbourhood Plan has been made by resolution of Newcastle City Council’s Cabinet on 02 June 2025.

Decisions on planning applications in the Dinnington Parish Neighbourhood Area must now be made in accordance with policies in the Plan unless material considerations indicate otherwise.
