### What is a Child Friendly City?

Child Friendly Cities and Communities is a Unicef UK programme that works with Councils to put children's rights into action. Newcastle City Council are one of the first local authorities in the UK to join forces with Unicef to become a Child Friendly City.

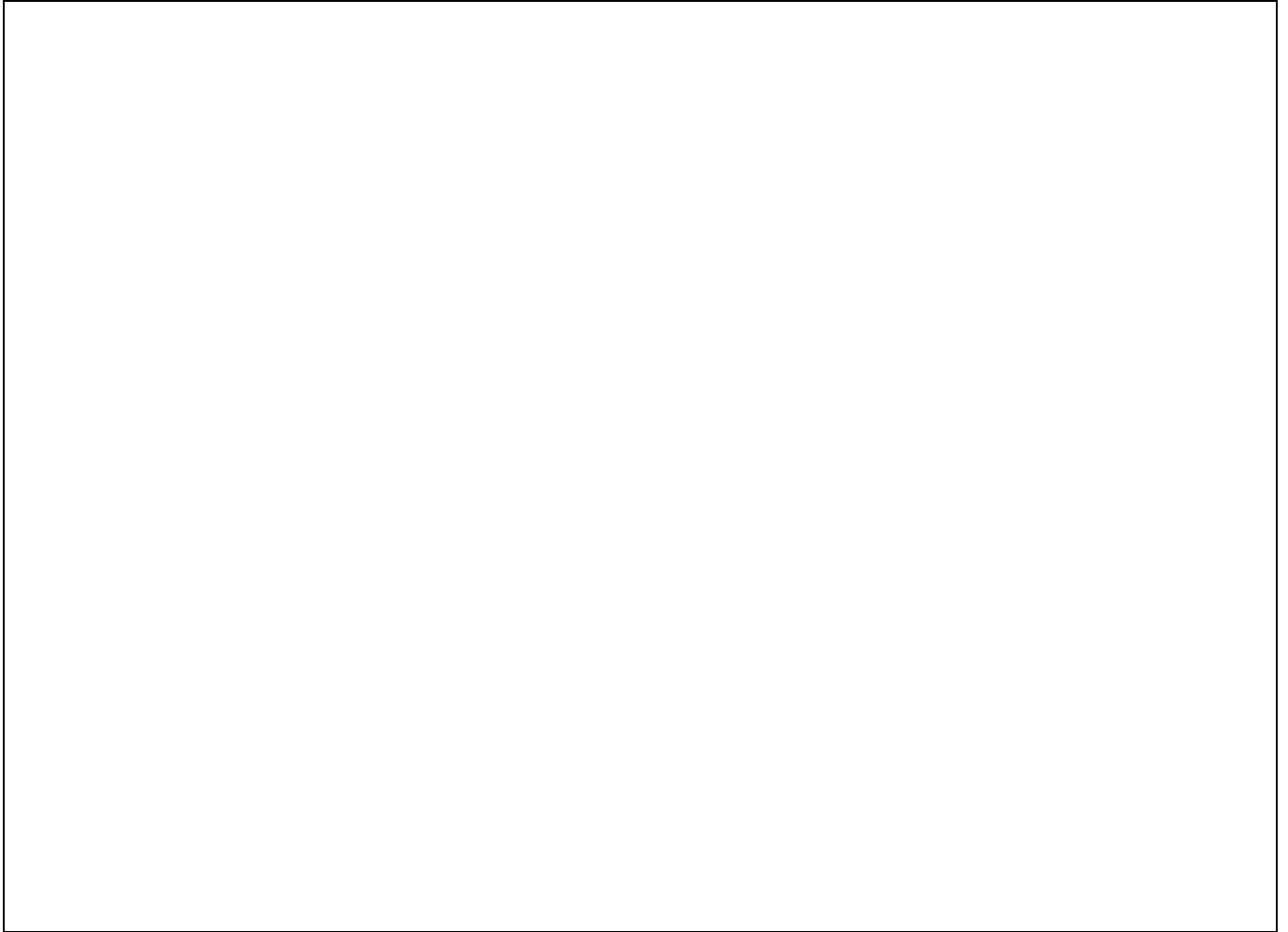
